



Ontario Summer Games Regatta Notice of Race

Windsor Yacht Club (WYC) August 7-9, 2014

Ontario Sailing and Windsor Yacht Club are the joint
Organizing Authority for this regatta.

1 RULES

1.1 the regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

1.2 All participants shall comply with the Sail Canada and Ontario Sailing Athlete Code of Conduct. All participants are required to sign Ontario Sailing's Code of Conduct which can be found at

http://ontariosailing.ca/media_lib/PDFs/Board_Governance_etc/Ontario_Sailing_Athlete_Code_of_Conduct.pdf

1.3 RRS Appendix P, "Special procedures for Rule 42", will apply.

1.4 Rule 61 "Protest Requirements" will be changed as follows:

Add 61.4: A protesting boat shall inform the race committee which boat(s) it is protesting at the first reasonable opportunity after finishing or retiring.

2 ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 the regatta is open to boats in the 420 class and the Laser Radial class.

3.2 Participants must represent a member club or organization in good standing with Ontario Sailing and be under 18 years of age as of December 31, 2014.

3.3 Sailors in the 13-17 age categories participating in the Learn to Train stage of Long Term Athlete Development, will compete in the following classes:

Laser Radial-Female (single handed Olympic Class)

Laser Radial – Male (Single handed development Class for the Olympic Class Laser)

420- Open (Double Handed development Class for the Olympic Class 470)

3.4 The qualifying process is now totally open except for 6 boat spots saved for the local athletes. Please note sailors competing at Cork can still compete in this event.

4 FEES

4.1 the registration fee is \$245 plus HST for each sailor (i.e. \$490 plus HST for a 420 team). Registration and payment is done on line at <http://ontariosailing.ca/youthracers/ontario-summer-games-windsor-ontario/>

This includes the full OSG registration fees, accommodations (all athletes and coaches must stay in residence), food, transportation to and from the residence, Ontario Sailing Shirt and Hat, and coaching at the event from the designated coaches supplied by Ontario Sailing.

5. SCHEDULE

5.1 Boat check-in: Thursday August 7 at the Municipal Marina beside WYC. Racing clinic to run after 12:30

5.2 Dates of racing: Friday August 8-Saturday August 9

5.3The maximum number of races is 20.

5.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on Friday and Saturday is 1100. No new Warning Signal will be made after 1630 on Friday or Saturday.

5.5 Two races must be sailed to constitute a regatta.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available after 1300 on Wednesday, August 6 at the Check-in Desk at WYC Draft Sailing Instructions will be available at the Ontario Sailing website (www.ontariosailing.ca) after July 15th, 2014.

7 PENALTY SYSTEM

Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

8 SCORING

8.1 the Low Point System of Appendix A will apply. **9 SUPPORT AND COACH BOATS**

9.1 Coach Boats will be allowed in the Racing Area during Racing, but shall not interfere with nor communicate with boats which are Racing.

9.2 All support and coach boats shall be registered with the regatta and shall be marked with a yellow shape distributed at check in.

10 VENUE

Races will be held on Lake St. Claire.

Accommodations:

Competitors will be housed in the Ontario Summer Games Athlete's Village. For friends

and families, several hotels/motels are within 10 minutes driving of WYC.

Food Services:

Competitor meals will be provided by Ontario Summer Games.

11 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the boat park at the Municipal Marina beside the WYC. Coach boats will be berthed at WYC.

Each boat's dolly shall be clearly marked with its sail number.

12 PRIZES

Ontario Summer Games Medals will be awarded to the top 3 boats in each class and Ontario Sailing will designate the winner of each fleet "Ontario Sailing Junior Provincial Champion".

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

14 RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTS, GUARDIANS, AND COACHES

Each competitor must submit a completed PARENT/GUARDIAN DECLARATION prior to racing.
