



2016 Hans Fogh Youth Regatta – Notice of Race

1. Location

- 1.1. The Etobicoke Yacht Club

- 1.2. Racing will take place on Lake Ontario

5. Rules

- 5.1. The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

6. Classes

- 6.1. The regatta is open to boats of the following classes. The class rules of the participating classes will apply
- 6.2. Club 420 (white sail and spinnaker)
 - 6.2.1. Boats in the 420 class may use any recognized 420 hull form and the standard club training rig (with non-tapered mast) and shall have a minimum weight of 100 kg fully rigged for sailing and in dry condition but without sails and personal equipment.
 - 6.2.2. Boats in the 420 class sailing in the white sail and spinnaker fleets will start at the same time.
 - 6.2.3. Boats must declare if they are sailing white sail or spinnaker at the time of registration. Requests for a change in fleet will only be permitted prior to the start of the first race and must be made in writing.
- 6.3. RS Feva ('S' and 'XL' fleets)
 - 6.3.1. Boats in the XL fleet will race with battened mainsail, jib and asymmetric spinnaker and 2 persons on board.
 - 6.3.2. Boats in the S fleet will race with un-battened mainsail and jib, no spinnaker and 2 persons on board.
 - 6.3.3. Boats in the Feva class sailing in XL and S fleets will start at the same time.
 - 6.3.4. Boats sailing with an XL mainsail will be scored with the XL fleet even if no spinnaker is flown.
 - 6.3.5. Boats must declare if they are sailing in the XL or S fleet at the time of registration. Requests for a change in fleet will only be permitted prior to the start of the first race and must be made in writing.

7. Eligibility

- 7.1. All entrants must be a member of a Sail Canada affiliated club or school.
- 7.2. All entrants must be under the age of 18 on December 31, 2016.

8. Inspection & Measurement

- 8.1. Boats may be inspected at any time during the regatta.

9. Fee & Registration

- 9.1. Required fees are \$30 per competitor.
- 9.2. Registration is on-line at <http://www.summersailing.ca/youth-regatta.html>
- 9.3. There is no other method of registration.
- 9.4. Competitors are asked to make every effort to ensure sail numbers, skipper and crew names are correct at the time of registration.
- 9.5. Requests for sail number or crew changes after registration must be made in writing prior to the start of the first race.
- 9.6. The first 100 entries will receive a regatta T-shirt.
- 9.7. Lunch is not provided, however a "snack boat" will be on the water during racing with bottled water and energy bars.
- 9.8. Registration of coaches and support boats is required.
- 9.9. There is no registration fee for support boats and coaches
- 9.10. A signed waiver form must be received prior to the skippers meeting on the first day of racing. Competitors, under the age of 18, require a parent or guardian signature (the term 'guardian' is extended to include a coach or chaperone travelling with the competitor) to sign the waiver form.

11. Sailing Instructions

- 11.1. Sailing Instructions will be provided at check in.

12.1. Early Arrival

- 12.1. For drop off of boats on Wednesday prior to the start of the regatta please email headcoach@summersailing.ca to make arrangements in advance.

13. Series Format

- 13.1. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series
- 13.2. When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 13.3. When five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

14. Scoring

- 14.1. Low Point Scoring System (RRS Appendix A).

15. Prizes

- 15.1. Prizes will be given to boats placing first, second and third in each class with five or more entries; to those placing first and second in classes with four entries and to the first place crew in classes with three entries.

- 15.2. For the purposes of prize giving 420 white sail and spinnaker will be treated as separate classes.
- 15.3. For the purposes of prize giving Feva S and XL will be treated as separate classes.
- 15.4. A trophy will be awarded to the overall winner of the Feva S and XL fleets when all scored together as one class.

16. Insurance

- 16.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability coverage of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per incident
- 16.2. The club or school with which a competitor is affiliated with will be responsible for the financial obligations associated with any incident in which the competitor is found to be at fault.

17. Courses

- 17.1. The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward or windward/leeward/triangle. Description of the courses will appear in the sailing instructions.

18. Support Boats:

- 18.1. Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel (including parents of competitors), intending to be on the water during the regatta, shall register with the organizing authority.
- 18.2. Support boats will be assigned a berth or mooring area for the duration of the regatta. Such berth or mooring is subject to the terms and conditions for all boats using EYC controlled facilities.
- 18.3. Coaches **MUST** carry a VHF radio and monitor the assigned radio frequency for the course they are coaching on, between the drop of the black flag on shore and the docking of the committee boat for that course each day. In the event of a safety issue on the course, coaches will be contacted by and will be required to follow the instructions of the EYC safety officer, the PRO or the CRO

19. Accommodation

- 19.1. Free camping is available on club property provided a responsible adult is also camping.
- 19.2. Before camping, please check in with the office in the main EYC club house to complete a camping registration form.
